- Volunteer guides and TLMs delivered to volunteers
- School books delivered from schools to homes

# Volunteer/Teacher - run Community Classes

- At least 3 classes per week for each grade (1 & 2)
- Class size vary from 3 to 10
- Unpaid volunteers identified and oriented across 7 districts

# Visits & Phone Calls by Block Coordinators

- Visit and demo classes to two volunteers every day
- Weekly calls to volunteers/teachers for support
- Monitoring of the program through visits and phone calls

### WhatsApp-based Learning

- Daily homework on WhatsApp for children
- Automated tracking of completed homework responses
- Automated report cards and certificates

#### **Tracking Student Learning**

- Dipstick assessments by block coordinators visiting villages
- Baseline-Midline-Endline assessments
- WhatsApp chatbot based quizes

#### **Parental Engagement**

- Daily instructional videos for parents to facilitate learning of the children
- Phone calls by teachers and Cluster Resource Coordinators (CRCs)





# LLF's focus on equity (Students at the bottom of the pyramid)

✓ 20<sup>th</sup> and 25<sup>th</sup> Percentile Scores much higher at end line.





## 'Har Ghar School (HGS)' – Reaching Learners at the Bottom of the Learning Pyramid (Equity Focus)

✓ Improved performance of the lowest performing 20<sup>th</sup> percentile children: The average scores these children at the endline more than doubled.
